

**Perquimans County Board of Education**  
**Special Session – August 6, 2012**

The Perquimans County Board of Education met in special session on Monday, August 6, 2012, at 7:45 a.m. in the administrative offices of Perquimans County Schools. Board members in attendance included Arlene Yates, Walter Leigh, Susan Cox, Steven Magaro (via speaker phone) and Wallace Nelson. Ralph Hollowell was absent.

Board Chair Arlene Yates called the meeting to order. Attendees recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

Upon motion by Susan Cox and seconded by Wallace Nelson, the Board voted unanimously to approve the agenda for the meeting.

Dr. Stallings presented the Personnel Summary Report to the Board of Education for its consideration. Mary Kay Peele read the items from the Personnel Summary Report to Mr. Magaro who was present via speaker phone. Upon motion by Walter Leigh and seconded by Susan Cox, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Superintendent's recommendations regarding personnel items as presented. Upon approval of the agenda, Dr. Stallings introduced Ms. Angela Greene, the newly appointed Principal of Perquimans County Middle School effective August 7, 2012. Ms. Greene introduced herself and shared information about her background. Dr. Stallings explained to the Board that Ms. Greene will continue to have administrative responsibilities in Wake County as Wake County can hold her for 30 days according to her contract. Board members welcomed Ms. Greene to Perquimans County Schools.

Also, Dr. Stallings noted that there has been some discussion about adding an additional Pre-K class at Perquimans Central School. Due to class sizes, there is currently space available for only one Pre-K class. Mrs. Fields has proposed using the technology room as a classroom for a second Pre-K class. Brenda Dail noted that 56 children were screened for Pre-K, with possibly 35 students being served this year. Mr. Nelson asked about having a report presented to the board on the selection process for Pre-K students. He also suggested sharing this information with County Commissioners at the next joint session of the boards.

Dr. Stallings mentioned that the Graduation Report was recently released and that the Perquimans graduation rate is above the state average.

Brenda Lassiter shared that former teacher Mrs. Sharon Tunnel had a heart attack yesterday and is in Albemarle Hospital.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:08.
