Special Session – December 11-12, 2019


The Perquimans County Board of Education met in special session with County Commissioners on Wednesday, December 11, 2019, at 5:00 p.m. at Perquimans Central School and then at Perquimans County Middle School and on Thursday, December 12, 2019, at 5:00 p.m. at Hertford Grammar School and then at Perquimans County High School to conduct walk-throughs of the facilities. Superintendent Tanya Turner welcomed the Board of Education and County Commissioners and Assistant Superintendent James Bunch facilitated the walk-throughs at each school. Mr. Bunch provided information about square footage and year built/renovated and highlighted the following items at each school.


Perquimans Central School and Hertford Grammar School – These walk-throughs were mainly a tour of the schools. Some bathroom upgrades are needed at HGS. There is some asbestos in the admin suite as well as the building behind the main office area at HGS.

Perquimans County Middle School – A new paint scheme was suggested for the entire building, inside and out. There are slanting floors in the classrooms at the end of the 8<sup>th</sup> grade hallway. The science lab needs renovations and there is asbestos down all three major hallways. Board members also observed the needs with the gym/bleachers.

Perquimans County High School – The inside of the school needs to be painted and walls repaired. Renovations are needed in the science labs, repairs in front rooms in the auditorium, as well as carpeting in the band room.
