New Business

2022-2023 IDEA Part B 611 Grant and 619 Grant

Chief Academic Officer of Student Services Dr. Kanika Griffin presented the 2022-2023 IDEA Part B 611 Grant projected allotment, \$390,812.00, which will be used to assist local education agencies in providing special education and related services to children with disabilities ages 3 through 21, and 619 Preschool Grant projected allotment, \$20,033.00, which will be used to assist local education agencies in providing special education programs for children with disabilities ages 3 through 5. Upon motion by Russell Lassiter and second by Leary Winslow, the Board voted unanimously to approve the 2022-2023 IDEA Part B 611 Grant and 619 Grant as presented.

Face Covering Policy

Superintendent Turner provided the COVID counts for the 2020-2021 school year vs. the 2021-2022 school year. She showed a map of North Carolina that indicated ten counties are now at the medium transmission level. ARHS said data is still below baseline for Perquimans and trending low. Active cases were up last Wednesday and more cases are being seen across the region. ARHS urges individuals to take precautions such as staying at home when sick, practicing good hygiene, getting vaccinated, and masking if high risk.

Senate Bill 654 that was signed into law on Monday, August 30, 2021, requires school boards to vote each month on their pandemic-related mask or face covering policy. Dr. Turner presented her recommendation to continue to make the wearing of masks optional for all students, staff, and visitors/spectators of Perquimans County Schools while inside school facilities and on school buses. Upon motion by Matt Peeler and second by Arlene Yates, the Board voted unanimously to keep the wearing of masks optional for all students, staff, and visitors/spectators of Perquimans County Schools while inside school facilities and on school buses. The Board of Education will continue to vote monthly on the mask requirement as required by law.

Budget Amendments

Chief Finance Officer Rube Blanchard presented budget amendments for the Board's consideration, explaining in detail the reason for each amendment. Upon motion by Arlene Yates and second by Leary Winslow, the Board voted unanimously to approve State (Fund 1) Budget Amendment #6, Local (Fund 2) Budget Amendment #5, Federal (Fund 3) Budget Amendment #7, Capital Outlay (Fund 4) Budget

Amendment #4, Child Nutrition (Fund 5) Budget Amendment #2, and Local (Fund 8) Budget Amendment #7 as presented.

Monthly Financial Report

Mr. Blanchard presented the financial report that was run on May 18, 2022. Due to the time the report was run, it did not include the May 25th payroll or expenditures paid after that date. The benchmark for funds spent was 92%, with the actual percent of funds spent being 70%. He also illustrated the budget summary in more detail sorted by 2-digit Purpose Code. In Capital Outlay, there is now \$276,480.84 unallocated for repairs.

Renewal of Errors & Omissions/General Liability Insurance

Dr. Anne White recused herself prior to any discussion or action being taken on this agenda item.

Upon motion by Leary Winslow and second by Matt Peeler, the Board voted unanimously to approve the renewal of Errors & Omissions/General Liability Insurance with the North Carolina School Boards Trust for the fiscal year 2022-2023 as presented by Mr. Blanchard. The premium for the upcoming year is \$3,493, an increase of 10% over last year's premium of \$3,176.

2022-2023 Local Application for Career and Technical Education

Career Technical Education Director Jill Cohen provided the entire local application for Career and Technical Education for 2022-2024. She presented an overview of the Perquimans County Career Technical Education Local Plan which highlighted areas of strengths, budget total, career pathways, CCP CTE courses, honor-level course offerings, credentials, presenters for state conferences, Career Technical Student Organizations, course offerings, and program goals based on needs assessment. Upon motion by Arlene Yates and second by Matt Peeler, the Board voted unanimously to approve the 2022-2023 local application for Career and Technical Education as presented by Mrs. Cohen.

2022-2023 AIG Plan

Chief Academic Officer of Curriculum and Instruction Melissa Fields provided the entire local Academically or Intellectually Gifted Plan for 2022-2025. Mrs. Fields highlighted the AIG program standards and practices for student identification, comprehensive programming within a total school community, differentiated curriculum and instruction, personnel and professional development, partnerships, and program accountability. This was a first reading only. Action will be taken at the June meeting.

Driver Education Bids

Assistant Superintendent Mr. James Bunch provided bid tabulation information for Driver Education Services. Only one bid was received from the North Carolina Driving School, the contractor that is currently being used by the district. The cost would be \$40.00 per pupil for classroom instruction and \$200.00 per pupil for behind-the-wheel training for a total of \$240.00 per pupil. Upon motion by Arlene Yates and second by Matt Peeler, the Board voted unanimously to enter into a contract with North Carolina Driving School for driver education services as presented.

Reports / Updates

Student Discipline Data

Assistant Superintendent James Bunch presented the student discipline data for April 2022. He noted there are currently two reportable offenses for 2021-2022. There were no suspensions to report for Perquimans

Central School, ten for Hertford Grammar School, eight for Perquimans Middle School, and six for Perquimans High School.

Closed Session

Following her comments, Board Chair Dr. Anne White did not take a motion to adjourn, but made a statement to end open session. Matt Peeler voiced his objection to the terminology used. Upon motion by Russell Lassiter and second by Arlene Yates, the Board voted 3 to 1, with Mr. Peeler opposing, to enter closed session pursuant to G.S. 143.318.11(a)(1) to prevent the disclosure of information that is privileged or confidential pursuant to the law of this State or of the United States, or not considered a public record within the meaning of Chapter 132 of the General Statutes to consider closed session minutes and G.S. 143.318.11(a)(6) to consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, conditions of appointment, or conditions of initial employment of an individual public officer or employee or prospective public officer or employee. Mr. Peeler objected to the validity of the motion. The Board entered closed session to hear Dr. Turner's presentation for her evaluation which will be conducted at the June meeting, but did not take action on the closed session minutes.

Return to Open Session

Upon motion by Arlene Yates and second by Russell Lassiter, the Board voted 3 to 1, with Mr. Peeler opposing, to return to open session.
