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# What is Title III

Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), as reauthorized by the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, provides funding to support programs for English Learners (ELs)—referred to in the law as “limited English proficient children”—and establishes a system for holding recipient states and districts accountable for their performance in raising English Learners achievement and English language proficiency outcomes.

Title III provisions require states to generate various data and performance information to potentially inform and motivate efforts to improve the education of English Learners.

# What Is Title III (continued)

- The Title III Federal Program support helps students to succeed with core academic subjects and meet the North Carolina state student achievement standards expected of all students.
